Tropicarium Park

Tropicarium Park Jesolo is a zoological garden which houses over 100 animal species from over 4 continents. The park is divided into 3 parts: The Tropicarium: with turtles, geckos, iguanas, amphibians, super-friendly Magellanic penguins, colourful tropical butterflies and many other interesting animals; Aquarium: with all kinds of colourful and fascinating fresh and salt water fish; Predators: big sharks, crocodiles, alligators and the beautiful biotope aquariums. The visit is a couple of hours long and you can take breaks along the way.

Prices: Family (2 adults + 1 child): € 50.00; Family (2 adults + 2 children): € 60.00; Family + grandparents: grandparents pay like children

Adults: € 20; Children € 15; Reduced (disabled/military/over65): € 16; Free: children up to 3 years of age and carers of people with disabilities who are not self-sufficient. Opening times: Open every day continuously from 10 am to 10 pm (9 pm last entry time)

Moéche

In spring and autumn crabs lose their shell for a few hours, hence allowing their body to become soft and squashy, hence the name moéche. Moéche are mainly fished in the lagoon by fishermen called moécanti, who use traditional fishing methods, to guarantee protection of the marine ecosystem. These moéche can only be fished a few weeks every year, hence making them a rare and very sought-after delicacy. Moéche are a typical product of traditional Venetian cuisine and are most often fried.

Discovering the Palazzo Querini Stampalia

The Palazzo Querini Stampalia is one of the most interesting artistic complexes in Venice. Main venue of the current Foundation, established by its last descendant, it cares and preserves the entire heritage of the prestigious Venetian family. A few minutes away from Piazza San Marco, the sumptuous nineteenth-century palace, with its original furniture, is full of artworks of amazing interest: paintings of Giovanni Bellini, Pietro Longhi, Giambattista Tiepolo, Jacopo Palma Il Vecchio and Il Giovane, Lorenzo di Credi, just to mention some of them.
