The "special opening" of the Venice Pavilion

The Biennale gardens are hosting a series of gatherings and opportunities for reflection and a rich programme of events. Although the international exhibition of architecture of the Biennale has been postponed until 2021, the municipality of Venice has organised a series of events in the Venice Pavilion inside the Gardens, giving a voice and a (free) space to the arts which, during these months, have experienced a real crisis. This initiative, which takes place over 13 weekends, is called "Aperture Straordinarie". It will bring the Pavilion to life from 29th August to 31st December and it will not house exhibitions or artwork, but it will host people invited along to share their visions and expectations of the future of culture. These gatherings will be preceded during the week by introductory events and will focus on exchanges and interactions between people from different professions and generations. Their objective will be to identify knowledge and experience a new way of living dictated by the changes that our society has undergone over the past few months.

DID YOU KNOW?

Jesolo and the tegnùe

The coast of Jesolo is characterised by the presence of some of those small reefs – Venetian characteristic in the Mediterranean Sea scenario – called Tegnùe: they are the habitat of many sea animal and flora species that make it an irreplaceable "lung" of life for the Upper Adriatic Sea. The so-called Tegnùa 125, located 3 miles from the coast in correspondence of Piazza Drago and Piazza Mazzini is about 16,000 sq m large and is at a depth between 15 and 19 m. The Tegnùa di Cortellazzo is particularly beautiful: it is located 3 miles from the coast of this hamlet, is 10,000 sq m large and is at a depth between 17 and 20 m. In each of these there are many starfish, sponges, crabs, sea-eels, small cods and (the real kings of the Tegnùe!) lobsters.

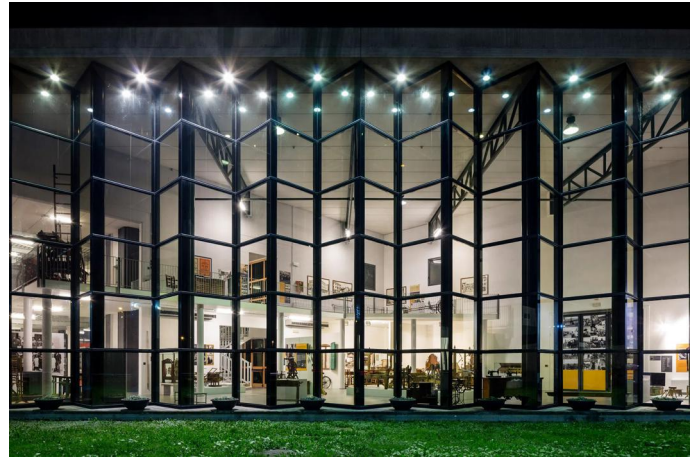

The Reclamation Museum

The Reclamation Museum in San Donà di Piave was refurbished in 2018. This establishment explores humans in relation to their surrounding landscape and looks at the amphibian nature of humans throughout the centuries, from ancient times to modern days. This institute is a natural eco-museum as it represents its city on a land surrounded by water, from the reclamation to the Piave; it is unique and presents material and non-material evidence, different landscapes, environments, stories and traditions. Jesolo is responsible for inventing the club sandwich, which is one of the first dishes people ask for when they come on holiday here. The club sandwich was created in the 60s by Benito Stefanel, owner of the 'Da Alfredo' restaurant on Largo Tempini; it is an original take on the US sandwich and now a staple of Jesolo's cuisine. Unlike its American counterpart, the Italian version of the club sandwich is served hot, it is cut in four parts and it features a magic ingredient: pink sauce.

Ingredients for the classic club sandwich:

Sliced white bread, bacon, eggs, cheese, lettuce and tomato

JESOLO AND AROUND

Gallerie dell'Accademia

Listed as one of the major Italian Museums, it presents the most complete collection of Venetian and Veneto paintings from the Byzantine and Gothic 14th century to the Renaissance, up to 18th century landscape painting. It includes artworks by Bellini, Giorgione, Tiziano, Veronese, Tiepolo, Canaletto, Guardi... Open from 8.15am to 19.15pm. On Monday from 8.15am to 14.00pm. The ticket office closes one hour before. Curiosity: the Vitruvian Man, the famous drawing by Leonardo da Vinci, is kept in the Gabinetto dei disegni e stampe of the Gallerie dell'Accademia. It is displayed to the public only occasionally, so it is not part of the normal exhibition of the museum.

Kenzo Tange, Carlos Ferrater, Goncalo Byrne, Richard Meier, Zaha Hadid. These are some of the most famous architects who have re-designed Jesolo city over recent years. The idea behind the project is bringing this Veneto city closer, in both concept and substance, to a modern beach city building upwards, while at the same time in perfect symbiosis and harmony with low density accommodation. A stroll around the city in search of its 'brand name' buildings by one of these architecture stars is a good day out. Here are a few addresses: Carlo Ferrater designed the Piazza Mazzini tower, Richard Meier the Via Levantina buildings, Goncalo Byrne the Merville tower on Viale Oriente.
